

Organizational Accomplishments

Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Initiative



In March 2021, the Arvada Chamber signed a contract with Thriving Culture, a Denverbased consulting agency, to audit, engage and educate organization stakeholders and business leaders on diversity, equity and inclusion (DEI) best practices. As the first step of this initiative, the consulting firm performed a comprehensive cultural assessment with internal constituents as well as its membership to understand cultural, structural, and leadership gaps as well as opportunities for development.

Thriving Culture then led 4 hours of DEI training for staff and organizational leadership (board and key constituents). In 2022, the Arvada Chamber will implement a 1-year & a 3-year DEI strategy that penetrates into all aspects of its leadership, structure, processes and routines. Ultimately, that will include training and resource materials for all members to make this work successful long term.

2021 Chamber Awards



Arvada Resiliency Taskforce

Recovery and Resiliency

The Arvada Chamber and its partners on the Arvada Resiliency Taskforce took on an expanded role of support in the community in 2021, most notably in responding to the Olde Town tragedy on June 21. The Taskforce partnered with Jefferson Center to provide immediate mental health aide and coordinated funding to support the families of the fallen.

On November 10, the Arvada Resiliency Taskforce hosted the 2021 Arvada Business Summit, a half-day conference to educate on emergency and mental health preparedness. **Over 125 businesses attended training sessions** designed to equip local teams with the tools and resources to respond to a variety of emergency situations.







Advocacy For Your Business

Through the Arvada Chamber, Arvada businesses are the voice that influences pro-industry regulation and opportunity in Arvada, Jefferson County, Adams County and Colorado.

In October, the Arvada Chamber of Commerce concluded its inaugural Candidate and Elected Official Bootcamp, a two-part series designed to help foster the mutual understanding and opportunity that exists between those who serve our region and the businesses that drive the local economy, All 2021 Arvada City Council candidates participated in this Bootcamp, as well as the following elected officials: Representative Brianna Titone. Representative Lindsey Daugherty, and Senator Rachel Zenzinger. Alphagraphics, Lakeside Insurance, Hope House, and Kokoro participated in a business panel, while Odyssey Beerwerks and Barber-Nichols offered in-person tours.

Through our Advocacy KAPS Council and consistent outreach to elected officials at all levels of government, **the Arvada Chamber took positions on 25 bills during the 2021 legislative session** and published the results in our Bill Tracker Scorecard. The Arvada Chamber also published the 2021 Election Guide ahead of the November 2 election.

Finally, we continued to engage and educate our community at large with **over 800** attendees in 2021 joining us for critical conversations at our Community Impact Forums.

Increasing Access to Healthcare

In 2021, we were proud to expand our healthcare offerings to more businesses with the addition of incredible providers and healthcare resources to the Arvada Healthcare Alliance (AHA). Healthcare concerns continue to grow for businesses and we will continue to evaluate innovative opportunities to support improved access and cost.









AHA is an affordable healthcare solution for members with no current coverage or those evaluating your healthcare model on quality, cost, innovation, or access to local care. With the AHA program, Arvada Chamber members can receive Direct Primary Care through Everside Health at just \$99 per month.

In 2021, the AHA program added a vision plan from Five Parks Vision and Eye Care that includes discounts for exams, glasses, contacts, and more. AHA also now includes discounted monthly Massage Therapy and Health Coaching through Boundless Body & Wellness. Additionally, the Chamber introduced new health resources and partnerships for all members, including 9Health and Amaze Health.

In 2021, the Arvada Chamber supported members with business promotion through **over 1,200 digital member mentions, 125 blog posts, and 45 written spotlights of businesses and leaders.**

The Chamber provided educational opportunities with a free marketing toolkit and hosted the Fall 2021 Marketing Webinar Series, a five-part crash-course in marketing for small businesses, attended by 24 business owners.

In March, the Arvada Chamber celebrated Women's History Month by introducing the award-winning Badass Women of Arvada campaign. Arvada nominated 125 deserving business and community leaders for the 31 spotlights published daily during the Badass Women campaign.

Improving Your Talent Pipeline

The Arvada Chamber is dedicated to ensuring Arvada businesses have access to the quantity and quality of top-notch talent they need to be successful.

WORK-BASED LEARNING

Work-Based Learning (WBL) opportunities connect local students and adults with businesses in an intentional way to engage in real-world work experiences. When optimized fully, WBL is an equitable, flexible approach for employers of all sizes, industries, and locations to engage and upskill the community's talent pipeline and directly serve the needs of the local economy.

In 2021, the Arvada Chamber, along with education, business and non-profit partners, made major strides in advancing work-based learning awareness and opportunities for the community. First, we launched a regional database for employers and talent providers to connect called Seamless WBL, increasing

the quality and frequency of activities that prepare job seekers for the workforce. **Currently, 81 employers** have opted into the system and the list is growing daily.

Additionally, in August, the Chamber announced the release of a Work-Based Learning Toolkit to help guide businesses through the terminology, data, roles, benefits and action steps of work-based learning.

The Arvada Chamber of Commerce was proud to be a founding partner of GROW Jeffco in 2021.



This initiative addresses the misalignment of school-to-career preparation, particularly for our highest-need students, and increases the diversity and pipeline of local talent.



GROW Jeffco is committed to a system solution hand-in-hand with education to employment partners resulting in measurable positive economic impact within our county and our state. We will do this through the development of high school career hubs which will:

- Engage employers in ownership of educational outputs to align to employer needs
- Train school staff across all high schools to offer career guidance
- Engage all students in career awareness and exposure and dramatically increase equitable career and skill development opportunities for students
- Train career hub resource managers to support schools
- Co-create and engage employers in a seamless WBL system
- Launch a community career awareness campaian
- Advance policy solutions to align school-to-career systems

ARVADA CAREER HUB



As local businesses experienced extreme staffing challenges, the Arvada Chamber launched the Arvada Career Hub in August to connect local job opportunities with local people. This digital resource is available to all businesses and non-profits that serve the Arvada community, making it the largest, most inclusive job board in the city. The Arvada Career Hub features a weekly job spotlight and links for large employer opportunities.

Developing Future Leaders

The Arvada Chamber is committed to providing programs, events and committees that are designed to cultivate the leadership that will accelerate your business. In 2021, we hosted two 12-week leadership programs: Business Bootcamp and Leadership Bootcamp.

In April and September, a total of 34 Arvada professionals graduated from 2021 Leadership Bootcamps. This award-winning program is designed for current supervisors, with weekly topics covering personal leadership, leading others and leading a business.

In July, 14 Arvada business and non-profit professionals graduated from the Arvada Chamber's 2021 Business Bootcamp. This program is designed for small business owners and high-level executives looking to grow their business, with topics focused on strengthening your potential, process and people.
