2025 is a big year: it marks our 100th Anniversary. This milestone is not just a celebration of our past; it is a testament to the resilience and strength of our business community and a commitment to the opportunities that lie ahead.

As we look back at the Arvada Chamber's history, we see a consistent thread of action around connection, advocacy, leadership, and resiliency. The Chamber's very first campaign, in October of 1924, urged Arvadans to vote in the upcoming election. The 1940s saw the Chamber respond to the needs of a country at war, followed by local concerns for the business community around transportation, water, and communicable disease. In 1962, the Arvada Chamber led a feasibility study to establish a college in Arvada, a need later filled by the Red Rocks Community College campus in 1990. And in this last half-decade, the Chamber led a response to the COVID-19 pandemic and pioneered the B.O.L.D. 2026 initiative to tackle the biggest business challenges in Jefferson County.

Throughout the past century, the Arvada Chamber of Commerce has been a steadfast advocate for local businesses, adapting to the ever-changing landscape of the economy and community needs. As we look forward to the next chapter, we recognize that the challenges facing businesses today are more significant and complex than ever before. Economic uncertainties, regulatory shifts, and evolving market dynamics present unprecedented hurdles for businesses of all sizes. The Arvada Chamber remains dedicated to utilizing our collective voice to improve the business environment for all.

As we celebrate this centennial milestone, we also recognize the importance of building connections within our business community. We understand that being in business can often feel isolating, which is why we're committed to fostering a strong sense of community among businesses across our region. + Digital Content Library

Every year, the Arvada Chamber creates dozens of original business education materials and hosts events with valuable presentations and handouts. These materials will now be housed in an easy-to-access directory on the member Info Hub.

+ Peer Mentor Cohorts

Hosted at the Business Resource Center, the Arvada Chamber will offer a mentor program for entrepreneurs to learn from seasoned business leaders in a variety of roles and industries.

🕂 Sales Bootcamp

Selling your products and services (as well as yourself) is an art every entrepreneur can benefit from. The Arvada Chamber will host a multi-part series that explores strategies for targeting, messaging, and closing in any industry.

Office Hours with an Expert

The Arvada Chamber will host experts in areas like marketing, HR, insurance, and finance for entrepreneurs to schedule short, pressure-free advisory meetings at no cost.

EOS Cohorts

The Entrepreneurial Operating System helps businesses of any size manage and support their teams, functions, and goals. These cohorts will assist small businesses in collaborating on and challenging their EOS progress and projections.

+ Amaze Healthcare Benefits

Members get access to an innovative solution from Amaze Health that helps cut out the time and cost of traditional medical services. For \$25 per employee per month, members get virtual urgent care, mental health services, prescriptions, and more.

• Day of Service

In its second year, this half-day event is an opportunity for businesses and non-profits to engage to better the community. Organizations host a variety of service projects to complete on the day and over 100 business leaders sign up to volunteer.

• Taste of Arvada

For over 20 years, Taste of Arvada has been the city's largest annual food festival, as over 1,500 attendees get introduced to area food and beverage businesses.

SizeUp Arvada

This free tool levels the playing field by empowering small businesses with data insights that typically only corporations can afford to access. Entrepreneurs can use the software to estimate the viability of their future and test assumptions of their business plan.

Business Trend Surveys and Snapshots

The Chamber is committed to using data to support programs, resources, and policy shifts. The Chamber issues quarterly business challenge surveys and turns that data into reports that are shared with the business community and elected officials.

<u>Crime & Safety Program</u>

This Arvada Resiliency Taskforce program includes the Crime and Safety Toolkit and educational programming, designed to help businesses enhance their security measures and educate owners and employees on effective crime prevention strategies.

<u>Business Resource Center Programs</u>

The Chamber will provide business leaders with targeted, expert-led learning experiences on the most critical and emerging business topics, delivered through a regular cadence of interactive sessions that will enhance strategic thinking, accelerate problem-solving skills, and enable organizations to navigate complex challenges and drive sustainable growth proactively.

This software introduced for Jefferson County Public Schools offers career seekers (and explorers) an opportunity to quickly understand career opportunities that align with their personality. The program, open to all in the community, also connects users to companies that are hiring for those roles and programs that are offered for upskilling support if needed.

• Employer Info Sessions and Workshops

Along with partners in Jefferson County, the Arvada Chamber offers workshops for businesses of all sizes to learn more about building work-based learning opportunities and one-on-one talent strategy sessions.

Work-based Learning Toolkit

This extensive toolkit guides businesses and non-profits through detailed steps to properly host and evaluate work-based learning experiences and, eventually, build a long-term, sustainable program.

Sector Partnerships in Advanced Manufacturing and Construction

Over 100 business leaders have joined partnerships in manufacturing and construction and meet regularly to drive action in response to talent, industry awareness, and supply chain challenges.

INCREASE INCOME-ALIGNED HOUSING

Over 80% of Arvada's workforce lives outside of Arvada and 40% of Arvada workers commute more than 30 minutes one way to their place of employment. More and more businesses are noticing that the cost of housing and long commute times are impacting their ability to recruit and retain top talent. The Chamber's goal is to ensure access to income-aligned housing so that workers can attain housing within reasonable proximity to their jobs. The Chamber is leading the way in education and policy while ensuring businesses have a voice to help solve this critical issue.

INCREASE CHILDCARE CAPACITY
